This is very likely to happen if disease has been the cause of amputation, but may result from the inflammation consequent upon injury or amputation; this complication would create an important difference; a completely stiff finger is a serious obstacle and ought to cause unfitness in a recruit, as being not only useless but in the way, materially interfering with the appliances of the hand. Contracted fingers are altogether objectionable; they unfit a man in nearly every relation to his duty, weakening the hand, causing awkwardness, and impeding him almost universally. I am aware that the fingers enumerated as admitting of amputation the flexor tendons. Did this affection not produce very great contraction it might escape detection, under a cursory examination; yet it should always disqualify, since it usually ends in the complete contraction of the finger or...
